# News from the prayer groups:

**Manly Prayer Group:** We have sad news, Paul Hair, a faithful servant of the Lord, who travelled throughout n z. giving seminars and bringing people to the Lord, has died of cancer in Kaitaia. He had only been there a couple of months and had begun to work in his community. His funeral was held at Orewa on Friday Sept 2<sup>nd</sup>.

**Manurewa Prayer Group:** Francis Stickney has resigned from the core team. Thank you Francis for years of faithful and committed service to the prayer group and ACCR.

**Blockhouse Bay morning Prayer Group:** Mark has resigned from leadership. Thank you Mark for the commitment you have shown while leading this group over the last few years.

## Diana Ingle, NZCCR chairperson, introduces herself.

(What a lot of experience and faith Diana brings to share with us all. I have attached this info separately if anyone wants to print and share it.)

Greetings! My name is Diana Ingle and I am writing to introduce myself as the new Chairperson of Catholic Charismatic Renewal in New Zealand and to tell you a little bit about myself.

I was brought up in the country south of Auckland and attended Baradene College in Remuera as a weekly boarder. As a family we went to a little local Catholic Church in Patamahoe. I always had a love of God and a strong desire to know him and when I was 14 years old I had an extraordinary experience in the Auckland Town hall at an ecumenical Pentecost service-I was singing to God from the depth of my being when suddenly like champagne bubbles the Holy Spirit rose up from within me and I started singing in tongues! At that time I didn't even know what it was; only that is was a beautiful experience of God. I wandered away from God into the world for a bit and then at 18 years old I had a miraculous healing of a tumor suspected to be cancer and one month later I willingly surrendered to Jesus as Lord of my life. I joined my parent's charismatic prayer group and attended Women's Aglow and then the founding meetings of Dove. It was not long before I was assisting my parents in their healing and deliverance ministry.

When I was 21 I felt a call to mission and went off to London and then to Ireland to do a Catholic Discipleship Training School with 'Youth with A Mission'. Evangelization work including dance, drama, testimonies and prayer ministry in parishes, schools, camps, on the streets and a Christian café followed. We went around Ireland, then over to Liverpool, Hungary (behind the iron curtain at that stage!) Germany and Austria. I then moved to Malta to join the International Catholic Programme of Evangelization for a staff training year, followed by a discipleship school in Rome(including a private mass with the Pope!), and an outreach in Germany. After a visit to Medjagorie I headed home via Pakistan (for 2 weeks mission with a priest) to help set up the first ICPE school and base At St Gerard's in Wellington.

After the sudden death of my brother Richard I left full time mission work and through a Catholic friend got a job as an Air traffic control assistant, kept living at St Gerard's in Wellington and helped run 'Firepower' (youth rallies and camps), Encounter Jesus (Adults rally) and 'light to the nations' (discipleship group) as well as deliver vegetables to the elderly for Catholic Social services.

Soon I went off to train as an Air traffic Controller ended up working at Palmerston North airport, learnt to fly and met and married my husband David whilst maintaining my involvement with Women's Aglow.

Thanks to David's work we ended up back in Wellington where I got involved with Firepower again, started a young adults group called 'The Olive Press' and a youth group called 'The Olive Tree'. During this time our 2 sons were born and I trained and worked a few hours a week as an Industrial Chaplain and was a member of the Wellington CCR discernment group. After 6 years it was back to the Manawatu where I retrained as an Air traffic Controller, had my daughter and started a women's home group ministry called Aglow candlelight which

multiplied into a number of groups.

After developing life threatening health problems while pregnant, I stopped work as an Air traffic Controller and after 2 years I had another miraculous healing and we moved to Christchurch.

In Rangiora we got very involved with our parish and I was the youth worker there as well as starting a big charismatic youth prayer group and being a regional leader for Aglow. It was through an Aglow conference in Seattle USA that I met Rita Bennett (wife of Denis Bennett, founder of the Renewal movement in USA) and trained with her in inner healing ministry and set her ministry up in New Zealand.

During that time I also completed first a certificate then a Diploma in Pastoral Ministry. I currently run the charismatic youth prayer group and a small charismatic young Adult's community in Christchurch , and am the chairperson of Christian Renewal Association which provides Emotionally Free ® inner healing courses, prayer counselor training, individual prayer appointments and 'the Holy Spirit and you' gifts course. Our dream is to have a healing/respite centre where people can be replenished by the Lord.

I get about the country a bit due to my ministry engagements so I am looking forwarded to meeting with Charismatic prayer groups, diocesan service groups, ministry leaders and individuals as I go. Please contact me and let me know about you so I can fit in a time to meet and pray with you.

My vision for the Renewal is to work with others on the National Service Committee and Diocesan Service Groups to bring healing and unity within the Renewal, to reconnect everyone, bring new fire and passion, and to mainstream the gifts of the Holy Spirit back into the heart of the Church.

For many years (decades!) we have been praying for a new move of the Holy Spirit and the Lord has given us many words about 'a new thing' and about 'the Joshua generation'. The Church also has been speaking of "A New Pentecost for a New Evangelization". Well good news! This has started among our young people! There has been a fresh and spontaneous outpouring of the Holy Spirit on young people all over NZ and they are very on fire and passionate about evangelization and are running outreaches centered on Praise and Worship and Adoration alongside the sacrament of Reconciliation and prayer ministry. At these events the Holy Spirit is tangibly present and deep conversions of hearts are taking place and people are being released in the Charisms. You may not know about these things yet as God is "doing a New Thing" as he promised us, but he is doing it with the Joshua generation as he also foretold. We should be very excited that after such a long time of intercession, God has answered us and is doing something beautiful! Please find out what the young people in your area are up to and get along to experience it and please support and encourage in whatever way you can. What you may find different about this move of God is that is happening in a more mainstreamed Catholic setting as opposed to a separate 'charismatic event', this is a great blessing to the Church and fulfills many of the goals of CCR. I encourage you to seek God's heart and mind about what He is doing before making any judgments about the way He is doing it through these young people. New things for a new season and new generation but something everyone can be a part of! They need the wisdom, intercession and encouragement of us oldies! Pope Francis has invited everyone from CCR to join him in Rome next May to celebrate 50 years of CCR! I will be going and would love to see plenty of Kiwi's there, so keep an eye out for more information!

We will also be having Diocesan based celebrations so I invite you to get involved in rejoicing in what the Lord has done in our lives and His Church through Charismatic Renewal in the last 50 years!! Get out your old photos and stories to share!

Please pray for the Renewal in New Zealand, that we will be docile to the Holy Spirit's leading in this next season.
